



DEMobilization



The ESF-8 Demobilization Unit is responsible for validating the orderly, safe, and efficient return of all deployed resources for public health missions. This includes supporting Responder Safety and Health until all resources are returned to their home base. The Demobilization Unit works with all Department Divisions and Offices and their designated Staffing Points of Contact (SPOC) to organize responders prepared to serve in core ESF-8 occupations and teams. The Unit utilizes FL Health's Responder Tracking System to contact deployed responders and provide them with important information and paperwork.



The ESF-8 Demobilization Unit works closely with ESF-8 Resource Unit to ensure situational awareness about deployed staff. Demobilized responders should check in with the ESF-8 Demobilization Unit upon their departure and return, using the Responder Tracking System or the Resource Unit Phone (850-545-0223).


